Community: A diverse and inclusive public involvement community is essential if research is relevant to population needs and provides better health outcomes for all.



- Understanding of the needs of service users and communities that the public sector needs to address;
- Closeness to the people that the public sector wants to reach;
- Ability to deliver outcomes that the public sector finds it hard to deliver on its own;
- Innovation in developing solutions; and
- Performance in delivering services.





Third sector organisations (TSOs):

- Independent of government: neither public sector nor private sector
- 'value-driven': social goals
- 'not-for-profit organisations': reinvest any surpluses
- Have costs and require funding

Headway Cambridgeshire provides specialist services and support to people with an acquired brain injury and other neurological conditions and their families across the county.


Since 1989 we have been helping people to live as independently as possible in their communities helping them achieve their full potential.




